Before his professional work in politics, Stephen Brooks spent five years with the private economic think-tank, the Conference Board of Canada, as Manager of Marketing, responsible for development of the Board's economic services business.

Yet as a longtime political activist, beginning at the age of twelve when he traveled from his hometown of Aurora, Ontario to Ottawa to volunteer in his Member of Parliament's bid for leadership of a federal political party, the prospect of working in professional politics eventually lured him to Parliament Hill where he worked for twelve years in government and political operations.

Beginning in 1993 as Legislative Assistant to a Member of Parliament, he eventually formed his own consulting firm, S Brooks & Associates, providing public affairs, technical expertise and communications services to a range of public figures and organizations.

In January 2003, Mr. Brooks accepted the position of Director of Operations to the Leader of the Opposition, where for the next two-and-a-half years he managed a staff of over 30 employees in the areas of public affairs, outreach, technical services and correspondence for the Leader.

In May 2005, Mr. Brooks returned to public affairs consulting, representing brand name pharmaceutical company, GlaxoSmithKline Inc., as well as Canada's Research-Based Pharmaceutical Companies, Rx&D.

In January 2006, Stephen joined the Chamber of Marine Commerce as Vice President.
